Happy Birthday Sunita originally came out of a series of workshops Rifco undertook with writer and performer Harvey Virdi in 2013. When we premiered the piece in 2014 it immediately struck a chord with the audience, and coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic seemed the perfect time to revive it - people have been battered and bruised over the past three years, and the manic, but ultimately loving trials of the Johal family is the perfect antidote.

As a director, it is rare that you get the opportunity to revisit your work afresh, and it has been a true delight to return to *Happy Birthday Sunita* with a brilliant new cast. I have been struck both by how much our attitudes have changed in the past decade, but also by the stigma that remains around open discussion. Family remains family, each with its own secrets and conflicts, and it can be an institution frustratingly resistant to change. Ultimately, however, the Johal family do find a way to accept growth, both in themselves and in their relatives. I hope that this truth is the one that people leave the theatre with; as maddening as it can be, family can afford us true acceptance.

I would like to thank our extended Rifco family: our wonderful designers and actors, the backstage and office teams, and our home venue Watford Palace Theatre, for working to bring this piece to life. For more than two decades, Rifco has worked to champion British South Asian voices and stories, through our productions and Rifco Associates Programme, something that feels as vital now as when I founded the company. It remains a privilege and a pleasure to make work for our community, and we hope you enjoy our latest offering.


# **BHAWNA BHAWSAR** SUNITA

#### PRAVESH KUMAR MBE DIRECTOR

Pravesh is the Artistic Director and Chief Executive of the award-winning Rifco Theatre Company, and he was awarded in the Queen's Honours List 2022 for Services to Theatre. He started the company in 2000 to make a different kind of theatre for a community that could not see themselves represented on British stages. He has been at the forefront of bringing British South Asian audiences into theatres in their thousands, often for the first time, by making entertaining and accessible theatre.

Pravesh has a background in film and worked in the commercial Indian film industry, often called Bollywood, for many years. His theatrical directorial debut was in 2000 with Bollywood - Yet Another Love Story (UK tour). He has gone on to achieve critical acclaim for Rifco Theatre Company productions: Dishoom!, Pyar Actually, Miss Meena and the Masala Queens, Laila The Musical, Britain's Got Bhangra, Happy Birthday Sunita, It Ain't All Bollywood, There's Something About Simmy, Airport 2000, Meri Christmas, Where's My Desi Soulmate?, The Deranged Marriage and Break The Floorboards.

His short film *Gods on Mountains* was nominated for the Satyajit Ray Short Film Award. His short film *The Deranged Marriage* was selected for the BAFTA - accredited BUFF festival in 2019. Pravesh wrote the book for the acclaimed rap musical *Mushy: Lyrically Speaking*. Most recently, Pravesh's debut feature film *Little English* (Resource Productions) is playing in selected cinemas throughout the UK, based on Rifco's play *There's Something About Simmy*. Selling out many screens all over the country, proving yet again that underrepresented audiences will come out in their thousands when you tell their authentic stories through their own lens. Pravesh is writing an ambitious new main-stage musical that will hit the stage in Spring 2024. He leads the Rifco Associates programme finding new British South Asian voices of the future.

He has hosted the shows *Dare to Date, Style Junkie, Get Gorgeous, India's Got Talent* (Colors TV), *Box Cricket League* (Sony Ent TV), and What's with Indian Women?! (Fox Life). Andy also hosts *Filmfare Red Carpet* (Sony Ent TV). Andy became a household name from his participation in the reality shows: *Bigg Boss* (Colors TV), *Jhalak Dhikla Ja* (Colors TV), *I Can Do That* (Zee TV), *Mehmanawazi* (Life OK), and *Killer Kareoke* (AND TV).
